December 2024 Update

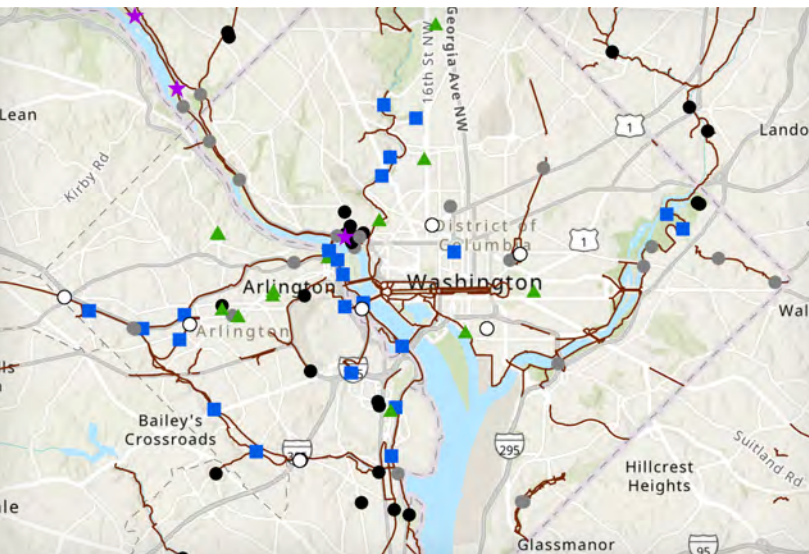


The Washington, DC region has **150** trail counters (with more on the way), one of the largest regional count programs in the country.

Highest Traffic: 1,360,000 total walking and bicycling trips counted on the Key Bridge in 2023, which is an **18%** increase from 2022!

Next highest trail count sites:

Mount Vernon Trail with **590,000** walking and bicycling trips counted near Theodore Roosevelt Island and **580,000** walking and bicycling trips counted near the **Reagan Washington National Airport** in VA in 2023.

Rock Creek Trail with **510,000** total walking and bicycling trips at Shoreham Drive in DC.



Uniting data from **5** agencies: **Arlington Co., Montgomery Co., City of Alexandria, National Park Service, District DOT**
